- OH film, non-confidential CDs or DVDs

- Post-it notes
- Empty catheters, feeding tubes etc.
- Smaller books and binders
- Packing tape and styrofoam
- Tubing

Used nappies/diapers, bandages and similar items shall be packaged and well-sealed. Noncombustible items and large items can be sorted as bulky waste. Individual glass and ceramic items can be placed in the household waste container if they are well packed.
